Purpose/Benefits of using the High School to Community College Transition Report



Track your students' community college enrollment and success after graduation.



Identify equity gaps in community college enrollment and success after graduation.



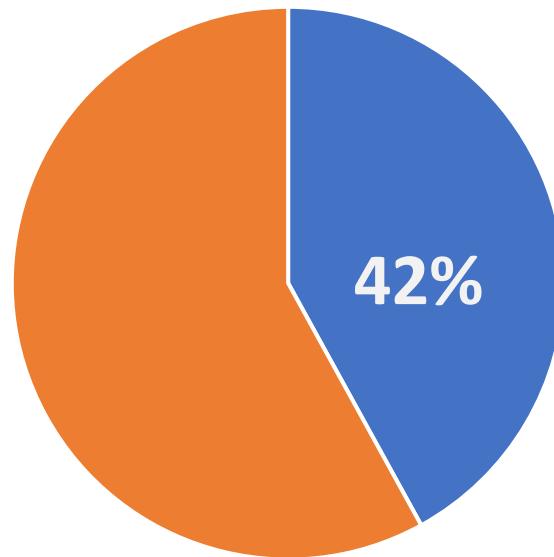
Compare outcomes and collaborate with others to determine best practices and ways to improve.

Why is it important to track your high school students' community college outcomes?

Example: HS Class of 2019 (CPP Members)



Many of your students will end up at a local community college. For example, in the HS class of 2019, 42% of high schoolers at Cal-PASS Plus member institutions enrolled in community college within 3 years of high school.

■ Did Not Enroll in CC

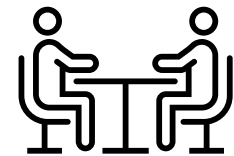
Use the data to connect with your local community college district and support your students' academic transition



Look at your data on the dashboard. [Utilize the worksheet on the Cal-PASS Plus Resource page](#) to help you ask key questions.



After reviewing results, focus on bright spots in the data and areas where you want to improve outcomes or close equity gaps.



Connect with your local community college district. If you do not have a contact, Cal-PASS Plus can connect you to our contact at your local district.

How to collaborate around the data to improve decision-making



Identify areas of success and how to replicate and scale those successes. Identify areas where you want to work together to improve outcomes.



Where improvement is needed, determine effectiveness of curriculum materials and district practices. Identify possible changes that can lead to improved outcomes.



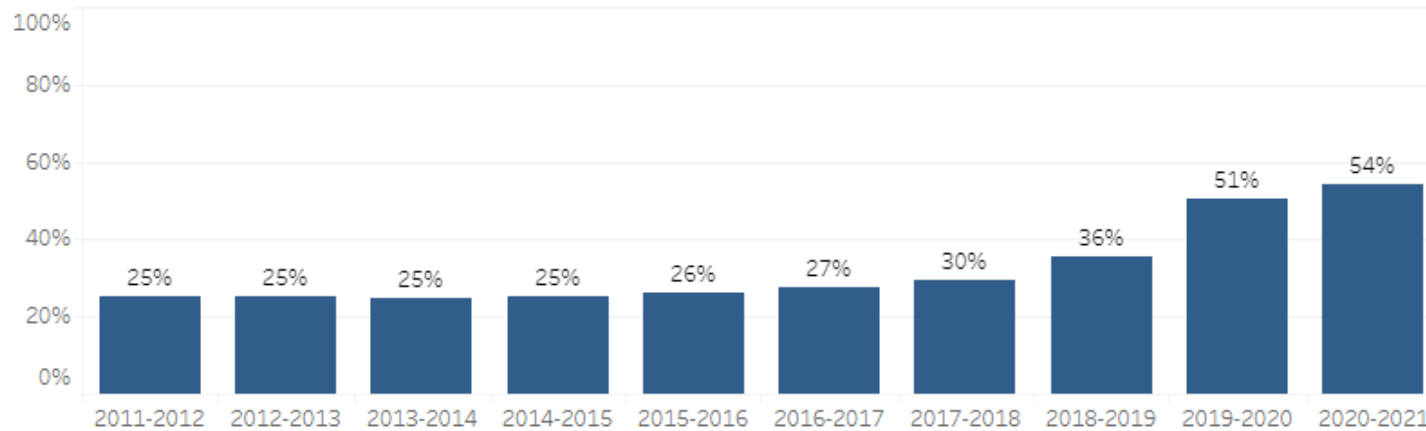
Maintain communication with your local community college district Cal-PASS Plus contact to share and receive updates. Review new data against benchmarks to determine success of efforts.

AB 1705 & AB 705 Impact

- As of Fall 2019, almost all students entering California Community Colleges are enrolled in:
 - Transfer level English
 - Transfer level Math
- There will be few exceptions for enrolling in transfer-level courses. Exceptions include:
 - English learners
 - Some CTE programs

Transfer-Level Completion

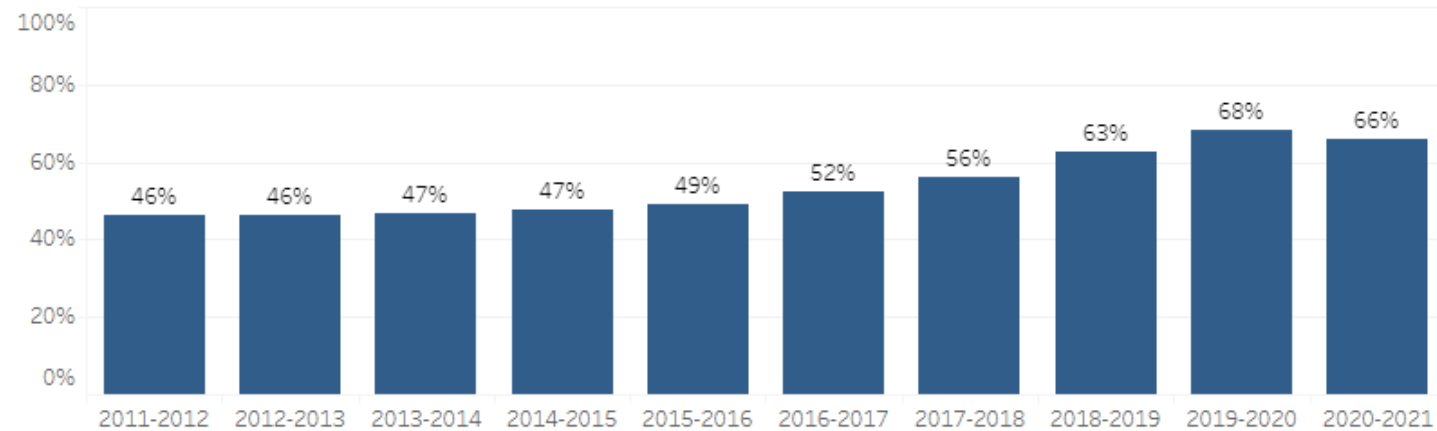
Successful Transfer-Level Completion Rates in Math



Since implementation of AB 705, Community Colleges have seen much higher rates and numbers of students completing transfer level coursework within their first year.

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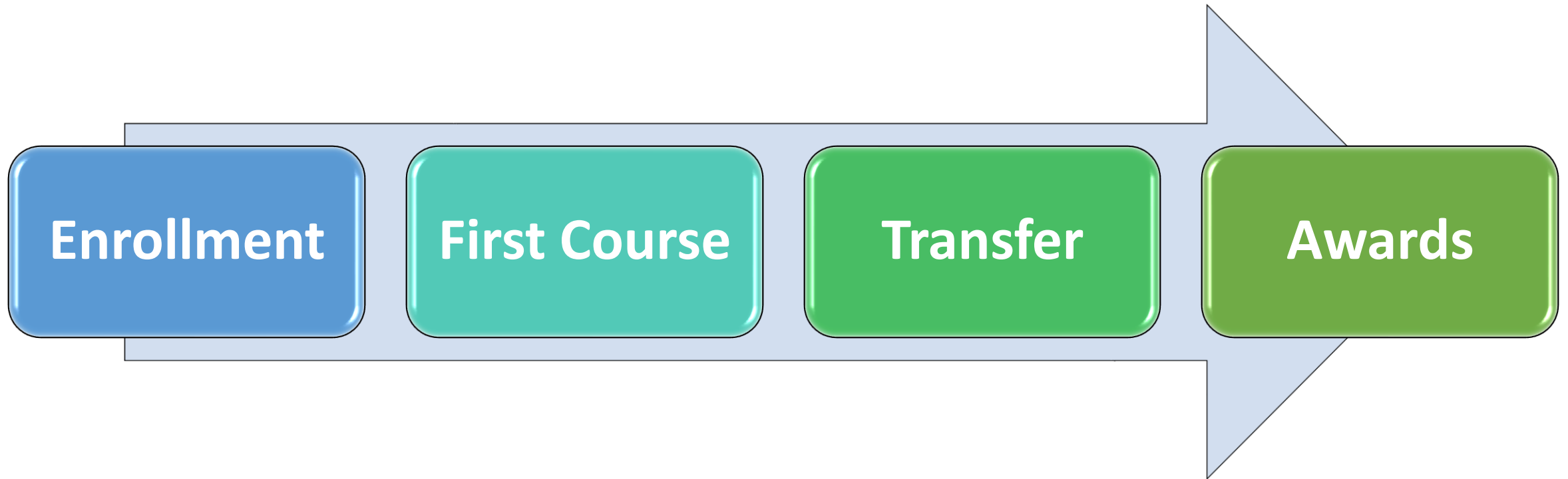

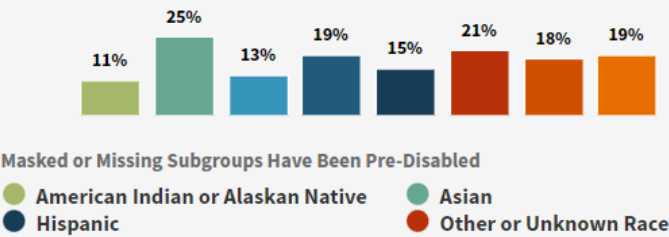

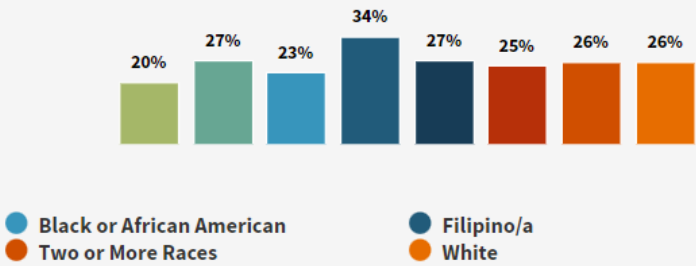

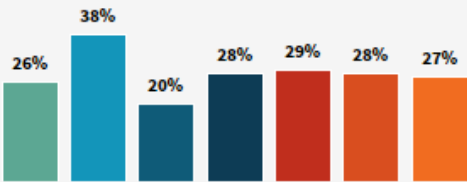

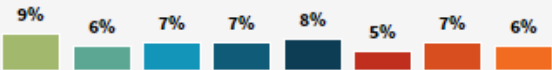

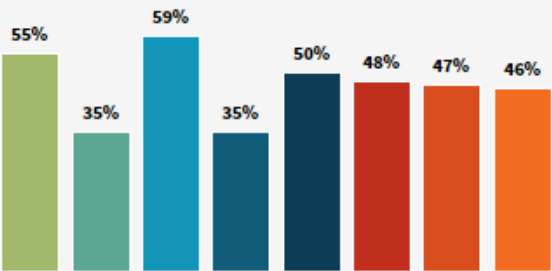

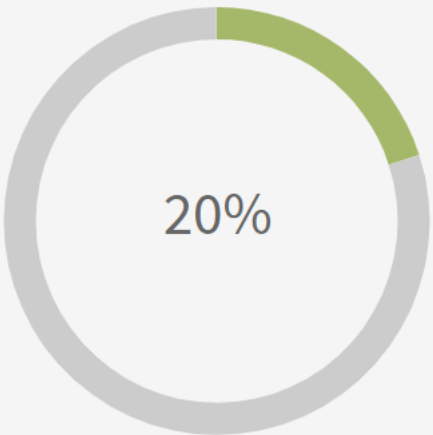

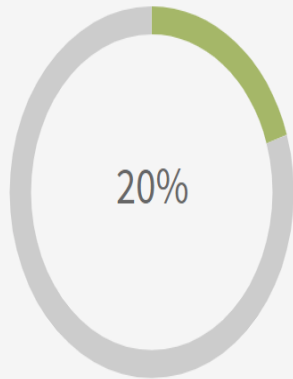

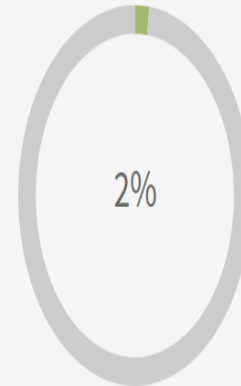

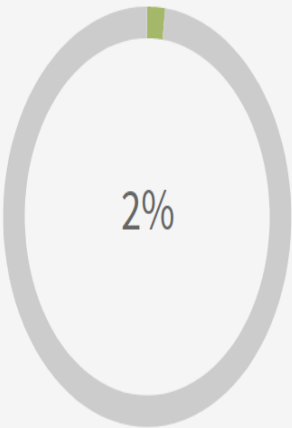

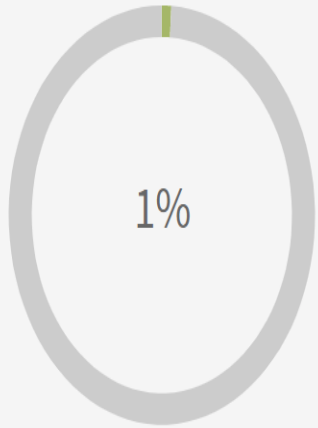

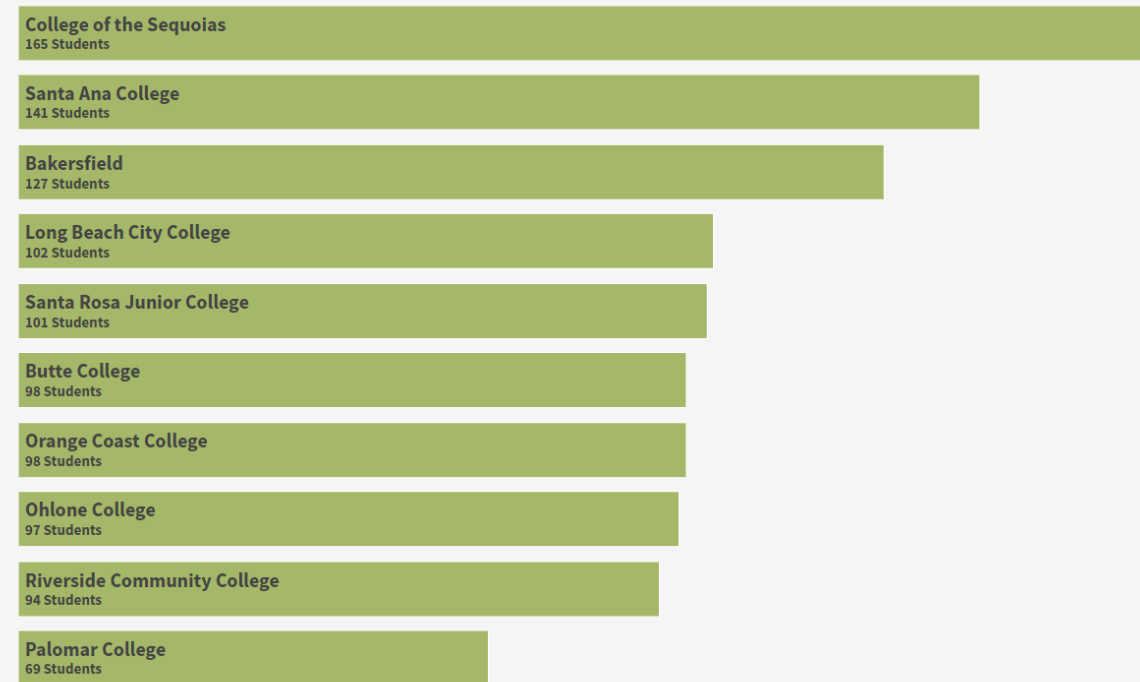

Number of Students Awarded a Local Certificate by Top 10 Community Colleges

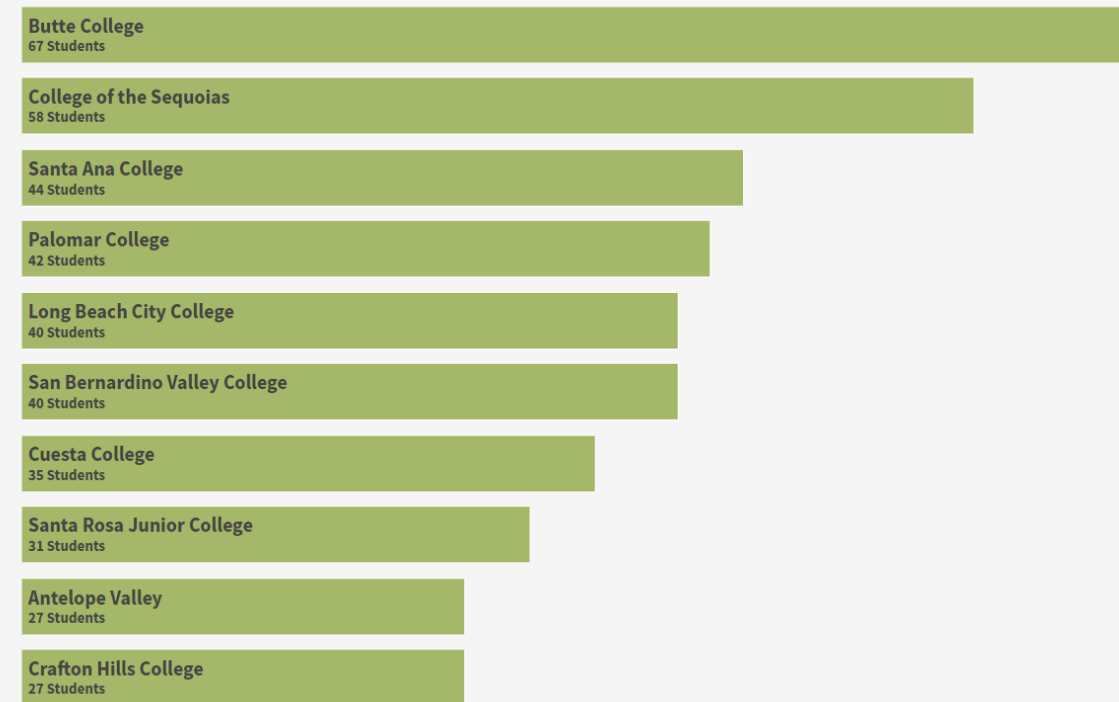

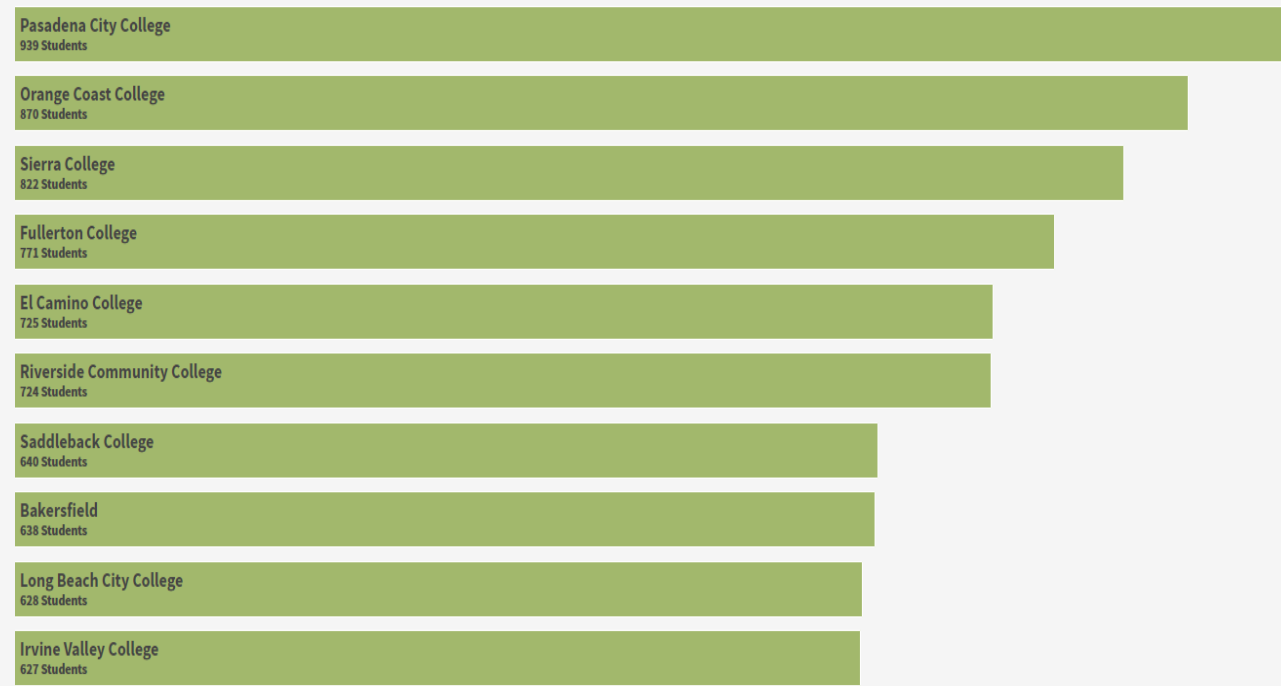

Number of Students Awarded an Associate or Baccalaureate Degree by Top 10 Community Colleges

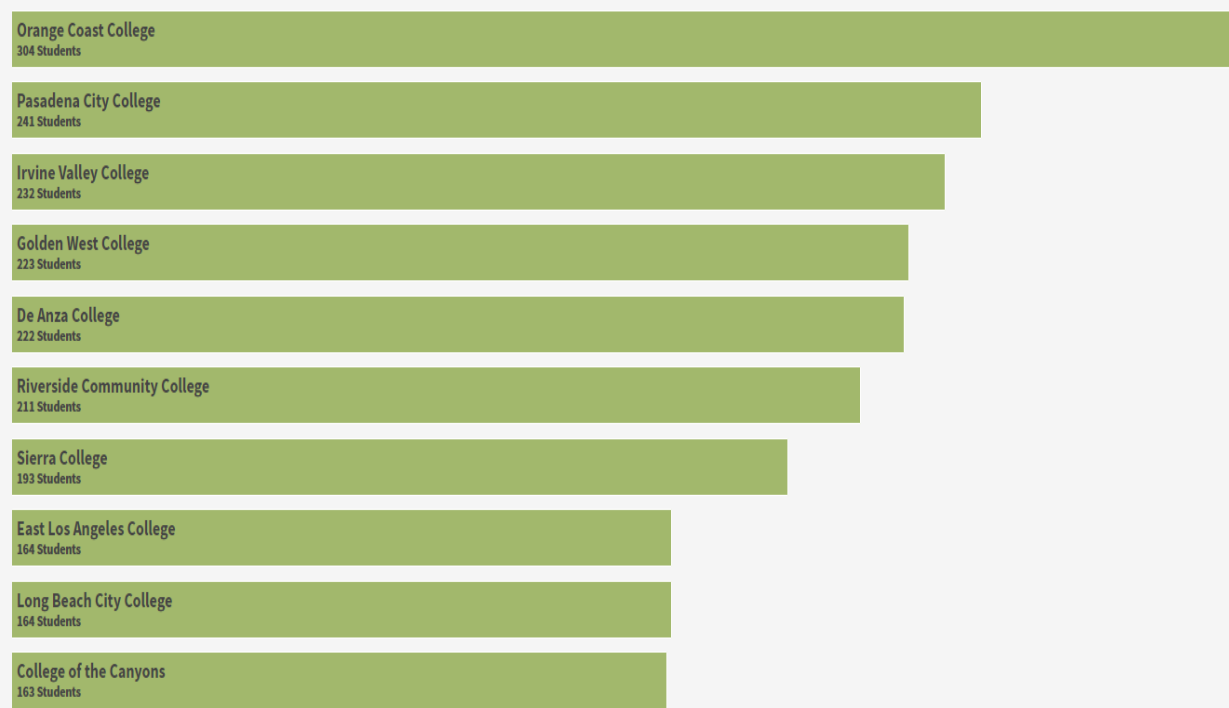

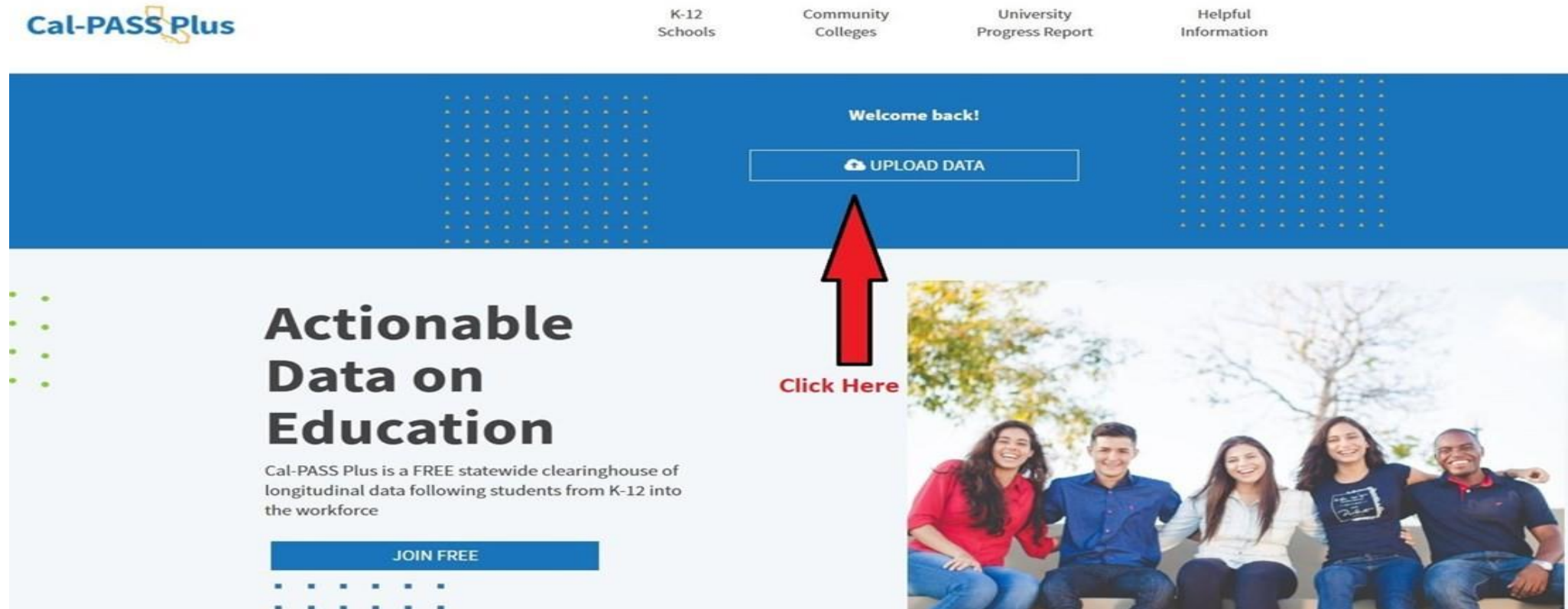
Where Did My Students Receive an Associate or Baccalaureate Degree?

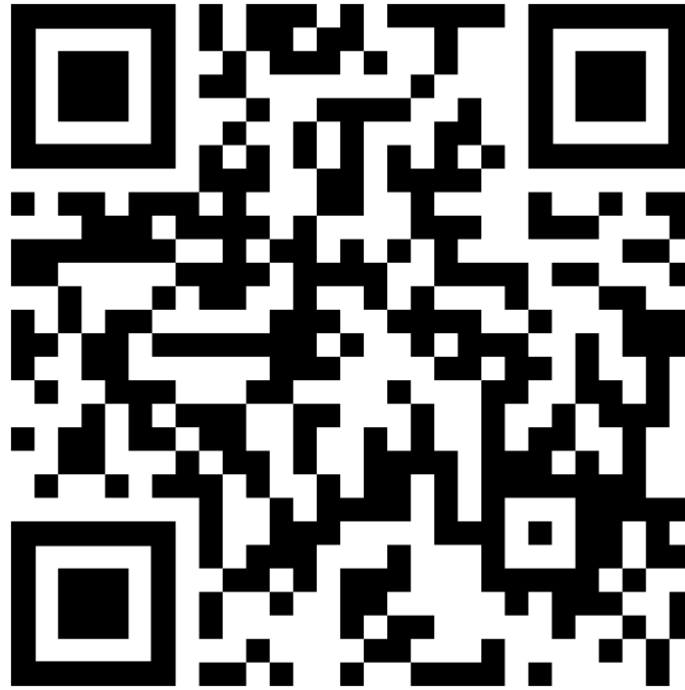
