




US Public High School Graduation Rates




College Completion Rates in 6 Years by Ethnicity

- Momentum points in the education-to-workforce pipeline are key to student success
- Lack of alignment in the pipeline perpetuates these choke points
- We can and must eliminate the choke points in the system


What do we do with the data? Identify "bright spots"

Applies big data analytics to uncover bright spots and find out why











Transition dashboard










How can I join Cal-PASS Plus?






