




#### **US Public High School Graduation Rates**




## Not enough are completing Cal-PASSPILLS

- We can and must eliminate the choke points in the system





## The CTE LaunchBoard



The CTE LaunchBoard, a statewide data system supported by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office and hosted by Cal-PASS Plus, provides data to California community colleges and their feeder K-12 school districts on the effectiveness of CTE programs. This information is intended to facilitate local, regional and statewide conversations about how to improve student transitions from K-12 to college and on to the workforce. #### LaunchBoard Features

The LaunchBoard includes several tools to support collecting and viewing information on student outcomes in CTE.

#### **Program Snapshot**

The Program Snapshot section includes program information and student outcomes that are grouped into categories such as enrollments, milestones, credentials, employment, and alignment with regional labor market demand.

#### **Common Metrics**

The Common Metrics section enables colleges to upload and view information on 34 indicators used to track progress on the California Community College Chancellor's Office's Doing What Matters framework

- Program Snapshot and Common Metrics tab revisions are based on feedback from practitioners in the field
- Developments are designed to drive program improvement

### LaunchBoard Revision

- Reevaluated metrics to ensure that
  - they better align with other state and federal initiatives
  - they are based on available data
  - the construction of the metrics accurately addresses the needs of practitioners
- Provide practitioners with visually-dynamic reports that address common questions



### LaunchBoard 2.0 Features

Expanded student information and disaggregation options:

- Students who have taken courses in the same pathway at another college.
- Students who had previously earned an award, such as a bachelor's degree
- First time/returning students
- Full time/part time students
- Foster youth, veterans, first generation students, basic skills students









## Trends in Earning After Students **Graduate**




How much money are students making?







#### File Submission

File Purpose\*

This page is for submitting your data files. We have created a new, simple process so you can upload your files without using the old "validator" system.

This file submission takes place over SSL-encrypted protocol and files are never stored on our web servers (not even temporarily). They are immediately deposited into the secure storage, not accessible via Internet. It is more secure than FTP (SFTP, or FTPS).



#### **Download Data**

Authorized researchers from Cal-PASS Plus member organizations can request downloads of de-identified student data from their sharing partners for research purposes through the Cal-PASS Plus website. That feature is currently only available on the previous version of the web site at https://my.calpass.org. It will be added to this web site in the future.

To complete a data download request:

- Log into the https://my.calpass.org web site.
- Click on the "Data" menu.
- Click on "Download" from the Data menu.
- 4. Click the "Close" button to accept the terms and conditions.
- 5. Complete the request form and click on the "Submit" button.

Your download job will be reviewed by our team. Once approved, it will be put in the queue for processing. Once the download files are created, you will receive an email that they are available for download. You can return to the "Download" page to check on the status of the request at any time.

# **BAKERSFIELD**

- PROBLEM: Too many students stuck in remedial courses
- Used statewide Cal-PASS Plus data to identify areas for improvement in local K-12 pipeline
- Redesigned assessment/placement process to allow multiple measures of readiness and additional supports


Results: 68% students placed higher, saving more than 800 semesters of unneeded remediation for courses they already completed in high school.




