Sacramento City College

- A partnership between SCC and its feeder high schools around the use of the 12th grade ERWC course to develop college readiness.
- <https://www.calstate.edu/eap/englishcourse/>
- Curriculum and course created by the CSU system.
- Not true “dual enrollment” but content at the appropriate level.

Sacramento City College

- Use of 11th grade SBAC/EAP to determine readiness.
 - Standard Exceeded: Freshman Comp
 - Standard Met: Successful ERWC = Freshman Comp
 - Standard Nearly Met: No eligibility*
 - Standard Not Met: No eligibility

*conducting research to determine if viable

Sacramento City College

- Expository Reading and Writing Curriculum
 - The course's 12 modules, which include a wide variety of expository texts and some literature, emphasize the in-depth study of expository, analytical, and argumentative reading and writing.
 - Course outcomes in near-perfect alignment with SCC's ENGWR 101 course, one level below Freshman Comp.

Sacramento City College

- High school teachers teach the course; SCC faculty teach ERWC modules in their own courses one level below transfer.
- Both campuses agree to pay for substitutes to allow faculty time to observe instruction at the other campus.

Sacramento City College

- Collaboration between CC and HS faculty.
 - Shared rubrics between institutions.
 - HS faculty participate in norming and grading sessions of common final at CC.
 - CC faculty work with HS faculty to create similar exams and participate in norming and grading sessions at HS.

Sacramento City College

- At the high school, the only funding needed was for substitutes. Each principal needed to agree to the expense (three subs per instructor, per year).
- At the city college, funding needed for release time for coordinator, stipends for partner faculty, substitutes for partner faculty (three subs per instructor, per year). Initially funded through Basic Skills funds; funded through Student Equity this current year.

Sacramento City College

- Advice for those developing similar programs:
 - Respect the culture of the institution.
 - Allow for flexibility
 - Partnerships, not oversight.
 - Won't happen via email; facetime is important to build trust.

- Identified Low Enrollment to CSUEB
 - Local Students from Hayward Unified School District
 - Hayward Promise Neighborhood (HPN)
 - Cradle to College to Career Pathway
- Equal Opportunity Program (EOP) Director at CSUEB
 - What is EOP?
 - What about the students who live within 5 miles of CSUEB?



- Target Population
 - Students entering 10th grade
 - Available for 3 year commitment
- Enrollment aligned with EOP guidelines
 - First Generation
 - Low Income
 - Foster Youth



- Selection of Participants

- Referrals

- Application Process

- Interview
 - Written Personal Statement
 - Referral from Teacher
 - Parents attend interview

- Enrollment celebration and campus orientation
- Weekly workshops at CSUEB
 - Math tutoring by college professor
 - Focus on study skills and life skills
 - Mentoring
 - Career exploration
- Monthly Saturday Sessions
 - Parent participation
